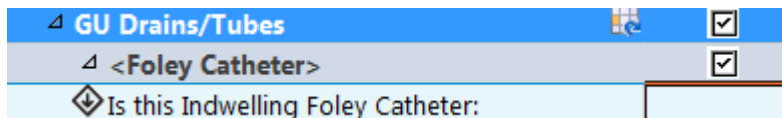


# External Condom Catheter

<b>Situation</b>	Indwelling catheters are the primary risk factor for the development of catheter associated urinary tract infections (CAUTI). Non-invasive urinary devices should be considered when clinically appropriate to reduce the risk of infection in patients.
<b>Background</b>	Nursing associates received training on a new external condom catheter product in January. The external condom catheter product is now available in MMD. A new order set and external catheter documentation is available in Cerner.
<b>Assessment</b>	A knowledge gap has been identified in the following areas: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• external condom catheter order set</li> <li>• external condom catheter documentation</li> <li>• application, changing, and care of an external condom catheter</li> </ul>
<b>Recommendation</b>	Nursing associates to review the below information

1. Obtain order from physician for external condom catheter
2. Document NO to the question “Is this indwelling Foley Catheter?”



3. Change every 24 hours and prn per manufacturer recommendations
